## Centennial Rendez-Vous

### General Information

#### Uniforms

Cub Scouts and their leaders are encouraged to wear either their field uniform or an activity uniform. The field uniform includes a Scout shirt, Scout slacks, a web belt, Scout socks (with the official yellow top), a Cub Scout neckerchief, and a Scout visored cap or the Centennial Rendez-Vous visored cap. An activity uniform includes a Cub Scout t-shirt, Scout slacks/shorts, a web belt, Scout socks (with the official yellow top), and a Scout visored cap or the Centennial Rendez-Vous visored cap.

Boy Scouts, Venturers and their adult leaders are encouraged to wear a field uniform or an activity uniform. The field uniform is to be worn during the evening Arena Show and the religious services. A field uniform includes a Scout shirt, Scout slacks/shorts, a leather or web belt, if a belt is not part of the slacks, Scout socks, a troop neckerchief, and a Scout visored cap or the Centennial Rendez-Vous visored cap. An activity uniform includes a Scout t-shirt, Scout slacks/shorts, a leather or web belt, if a belt is not part of the slacks, Scout socks, and a Scout visored cap or the Centennial Rendez-Vous visored cap.

#### Trading Post
